WHY SHOULD I KEEP PRAYING?

How do we Pray?

Luke 11:1a (NIV) One day Jesus was praying in a certain <u>place</u>. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, <u>teach us to pray</u>, just as John taught his disciples."

Luke 11:2 (NIV) He said to them, "When you pray, say: 'Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. ³ Give us each day our daily bread. ⁴ Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us. And lead us not into temptation.'

1). Start with God (not you).

When you pray, say: 'Father, hallowed be your name.

2). Your will (over my will).

Your kingdom come. (Your will be done)

3). Please provide my needs.

³ Give us each day our daily bread.

4). Forgive me and help me to forgive others.

⁴ Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us.

5). Help me to obey.

And lead us not into temptation.

Why we should keep praying?

Luke 11:5 (NIV) Then Jesus said to them, "Suppose you have a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; ⁶ a friend of mine on a journey has come to me, and I have no food to offer him.'

⁷ And suppose the one inside answers, 'Don't bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can't get up and give you anything.'

⁸ I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you the bread because of friendship, yet because of your <u>shameless audacity</u> he will surely get up and give you as much as you need.

⁹ "So I say to you: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.

¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.

QUESTION: What have you given up on?

- Sometimes He'll do the very <u>thing we ask for</u>. But it's not always on our timetable or schedule.
- Sometimes He'll do something in us, while we're waiting.
- Sometimes He'll reveal to us we're praying for the wrong thing.
