God's Sovereignty

God wants to have a relationship with us, so He cannot remove free will and force us to do only what is right. He needs to allow us to choose.

Romans 8:28 (NIV)

And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. When evil happens we have a promise from a sovereign God that all things work for the good of those who love Him.

For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, 39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NLT)

All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. 17 God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work.



James 1:5 (NLT)

If you need wisdom, ask our generous God, and he will give it to you. He will not rebuke you for asking.
